

Since January 2010, Dr. Waded Cruzado has served as the 12th President of Montana State University. During her tenure, she has significantly reshaped the face and the future of the state's first land-grant institution and premier university.

Under Cruzado's leadership MSU has changed dramatically. The university has set new student enrollment records, becoming the fastest growing and largest university in the state. Cruzado is known for placing student success as her top priority and providing new pathways to higher education, and MSU's students routinely win prestigious national awards.

Montana State University's research enterprise has flourished under President Cruzado, becoming the only Carnegie R1 university to also be classified as a Carnegie Community-Engaged as well as Carnegie Very High Undergraduate institution.

Under President Cruzado, the campus has seen the completion of numerous major construction, renovation and repurposing capital projects. She has substantially grown the philanthropic support for the university, registering over \$500 million in capital projects supported with private dollars, including new buildings for the Jake Jabs College of Business & Entrepreneurship, the Norm Asbjornson College of Engineering and five new buildings for the Mark & Robyn Jones College of Nursing.
